MINUTES OF THE ZONING BOARD: March 3, 2011

The Public Hearing on the matter of the application of Kimberly Coye-Brown opened at 7:35 P.M. The applicant and a neighbor, Paul Depew, spoke in support of the application. No persons spoke in opposition to the proposed special use permit. The Board was advised by counsel that this is a permitted use under Section 514, of the Zoning Ordinance. The hearing closed at 7:40 P.M. and the Board then made the following findings.

Whereas, the special use permit requested is not substantial; and

Whereas, the use permit complies with the Code Requirements for a home occupation; and

Whereas, the applicant cannot complete the project by any other feasible method without the permit requested; and

Whereas the proposed permit will not have an adverse effect on the physical condition of the neighborhood.

Therefore, it was **RESOLVED** that the Board approves the application for a special use permit for the purpose of opening a hair salon in the applicant's home as a permitted home occupation. Motion made by Robert Lieber, seconded by Linda Riehlman to grant the applicant's application for a special use permit, all in favor, the motion carried.
